In the wake of the tragedy that has taken place in Newtown, Connecticut and Sandy Hook Elementary School, I want you and your child/children to know that our staff at WJHS is committed to making your student(s) feel safe, loved, and cared for in so many ways beyond the normal obligations of an educational facility.

As a parent of students within this school district myself, I send my 6 year old twins, Blake and Isabelle, to Sherman Elementary School each day. On most days in this fast paced world we live in, I take for granted the importance of the bus driver, the office staff, the administration, the teachers, the custodians and cooks, and so on who supervise and watch over Blake and Isabelle each day.

Not any longer do I take this for granted.

I can't help feeling extremely thankful, fortunate, and blessed for the job they do each day providing a quality experience for my children and then getting them home to me safely. As a parent, I send my children off to someone else (school, daycare, etc.) each day I go to work. As I send them off, I can only hope and pray they return to me safely. I place trust in those that are in charge of them from that moment forward, until the time they return home to me.

I guess I could quit my job, home school them, and watch over them daily. That's just not practical, we wouldn't have enough money to make ends meet. That's the state of this modern world we live in. I'm sure most of you are in the same position as myself.

Each day, you send your children to WJHS. When reality hits us like it did Friday, you begin to hope and pray that your children are safe and secure, and brought home safely just as I do with my children. You begin to ask yourself, "how much do I trust our community, school, and beyond?"

To start our day on Monday, I made it a point to let our students know just that. I hope this provides some comfort for both the students and the families at home. I know I feel good about my twins, Blake and Isabelle, attending SES. Mrs. Lindsey and the staff are committed and caring.
