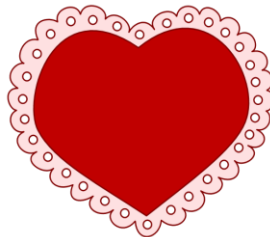
These students will receive their awards at Springfield High School Auditorium. Their art will be on exhibit at the Springfield Art Association until February 23, 2018.
